



LIMONE PIEMONTE SHINES AT THE VUELTA A ESPAÑA 2025

The Vuelta rides through Limone

After the Giro d'Italia and the Tour de France, it's now the turn of the Vuelta a España: Piedmont enters the history books of world cycling as the only Italian region to have hosted the start of all three Grand Tours. A historic event that will culminate on Sunday, August 24, with the finish of the second stage right in Limone Piemonte, in the heart of the Maritime Alps.

The alpine town, already a popular destination for winter sports and summer mountain holidays, is preparing to take center stage. Riders will depart from Alba and, after crossing the stunning landscapes of the Langhe and Cuneo area, will face the first real mountain finish of the race right in Limone, at an altitude of 1400 meters, scheduled around 5:30 p.m. A stage for true climbers, and a unique opportunity for international exposure for this alpine village.

Millions of viewers in over 190 countries will be able to admire the spectacular scenery of the Riserva Bianca live – a stunning mix of forests, peaks, and unspoiled nature. It will be an unprecedented promotion for Limone, reinforcing its role as a strategic hub for high-altitude cycling tourism and the ideal destination for those seeking sport, wellness, and authenticity.

The arrival of the Vuelta is also a symbol of rebirth: after suffering the effects of extreme weather events and infrastructural challenges in the past, Limone Piemonte now steps back into the spotlight with an event that blends sport, tourism, and alpine beauty. It will be a grand celebration for locals and visitors alike, with special events planned throughout the week – along with themed window displays and a warm, Iberian-style welcome.

August 24 won't just be a must-watch

date for cycling fans, but an unmissable opportunity to showcase to the world the hospitality, flavors, and quality of life that only a place like Limone can offer.

What is the Vuelta a España?

The Vuelta a España is one of the three great stage races in professional cycling, alongside the Tour de France and the Giro d'Italia. Held annually in August and September, it lasts three weeks and crosses some of Spain's most breathtaking landscapes. Known for its toughness, dramatic climbs, and the coveted Red Jersey worn by the overall race leader, the Vuelta is a true test of champions.
